KEY MILESTONES

AUGUST 1968

Founded by Norman C. Mooney, Rev. Dr. C.P. Williams, and Richard "Dick" Webster, "The Guild" was formed to celebrate Dr. King's message of doing for others as he urged us to embrace a spirit of service and compassion, recognizing that our actions have the power to create positive change.

JANUARY 1995

The Guild merged with the Community Action Board of Greater Long Branch to strengthen its efforts to support Dr. King's legacy by working toward a more just and equitable society, where everyone is valued and respected, regardless of their race, ability, religion, or background.

JANUARY 2001

MLK Park was dedicated as a reminder to us to continue to uphold the tenets and beliefs of the late Dr. King.
